

SPFMS Hosts Training on Audit Objections and Resolutions



A two-day training program on “*Audit, Audit Objections and Resolutions*” concluded from 3-5 June 2025 at the Strengthening Public Financial Management Program to Enable Service Delivery (SPFMS) office in Dhaka, aiming to build the capacity of 26 Junior Consultants in effectively handling audit processes and objections.

The program opened on June 3 with a welcome address from Tanima Tasmin, Program Executive and Coordinator (Joint Secretary), SPFMS. She highlighted the importance of strengthening audit knowledge for improving public financial accountability.

The first session was conducted by Miajee Md. Shaifulla Shobhan, Deputy Comptroller and Auditor General (Accounts and Reports), who explained the mandate of audit institutions and the reasons behind raising audit objections. “Audit is not merely a compliance tool; it is a mechanism to ensure transparency, efficiency, and trust in public financial management,” he noted.



Over the course of the training, participants explored compliance, financial, performance, and issue-based audits. Practical exercises on the Audit Management and Monitoring System and detailed instruction on the settlement of objections offered hands-on learning.

At the closing ceremony on June 4, Bilquis Jahan Rimi, Additional Secretary (Budget-1), Finance Division and National Program Director of SPFMS, distributed certificates and praised the participants’ engagement. “Strong audit capacity is crucial for safeguarding resources and promoting better service delivery within the public sector,” she said.

Participants expressed that the training boosted their confidence in navigating audit procedures and resolving objections efficiently. The initiative reflects SPFMS’s commitment to promoting robust financial governance and accountability across Bangladesh’s public sector.
